# Faith Of A Child

What happened to little Emanuel was every parents' nightmare. Your baby is sick with a fever that can't be controlled. At the hospital they pump him full of antibiotics to save his life. But what saved his life all but destroyed his hearing. Four years later you're told he needs hearing aids or he won't be able to keep up in school. This is Emanuel's story in a nutshell. In September, they sought financial help from DIF, Mexico's child services. They did qualify for assistance, but still had to save for the other half of the expense. After 6 months, they were still short and asked us for help. We were able to give them what was needed March 24. Manny's dad drove all the way from Xalapa, Veracruz to pick it up, and he was fitted with his first hearing aid March 26!

It's such a privilege to be part of the process in blessing this family. In the video they gave us as a "thank you," Manny is nervous and unsure of what the doctor is doing to him. He keeps looking to his parents for reassurance. His faith is in his parents' love. The moment he hears their voices, his joy is directed their way. The doctor had done his part as we did ours, but this little boy only had eyes for his parents!

We should never outgrow that kind of faith. Jesus said that unless we have the faith of a little child, we won't ever be able to see the kingdom of God. Little Manny's experience reminds us that our focus shouldn't be on the circumstances we find ourselves in. Yes, we must deal with really "grown up" kinds of situations, but child-like faith can meet them head on.

Some of our pastors continue to be hassled at the border crossings as they return to Mexico. Their own agents have charged them import fees to bring in the things they've received from CBM, and they are told they won't be allowed to cross beans and rice "next time." And we've just had a new obstacle arise; our "egg man" George Hughes learned he won't receive any more donated eggs! The stores must now destroy any eggs they can't sell! So we go from George bringing 300 dozen eggs per month to zero. It's a terrible disappointment for everyone involved!

Does this mean we quit feeding the poor? Of course not! Eggs are only one part of all the pastors receive. You know this kind of thing has happened before, and if one door closes our mighty God is getting another door ready to open! We can worry and complain, or we can PRAY and watch what He will do. We know our God has limitless resources and unstoppable methods. We have beans, rice, groceries, and everything else that you all help supply. And the pastors ARE still crossing with all of it. Who knows, God may have a warehouse full of dehydrated eggs that don't need refrigeration ready to be sent our way. He's just looking for those with the faith to receive it!

Child-like faith is NOT wishful thinking! Just read this excerpt from the April-May publication of Double Mountain Baptist Association in Stamford, TX. This group of churches have been HUGE supporters of the school supply drive since we began.



#### **CROSSING BORDERS SCHOOL SUPPLY MISSION**

Last year I was telling a church about how we collect the money, then order school supplies, come together and assemble packets and take them to Fabens to Crossing Borders Ministry. I told them these school supplies go to children in the villages who without them would not go to school. The pastors in the villages give them to the children. When church was over a young boy in stature and years, but wise in the things that matter, came up to me. This is what he said, "I told my mom I want to get \$100 out of my money and give it for school supplies." Blew me away, and his mom too! I began to tell him he didn't have to do that, that even \$10 would be a great amount and he said, "Mom said we would talk about it."

That night they talked about many ways he could help other people too and that he didn't have to give that much to Crossing Borders. The next morning he and his mom came in my office. He handed me five 20 dollar bills and said this is for the children so they can go to school. Of course he was happy, and me, well I started to cry. He did not know what to say then!

Oh my, how little we know the work of our Lord. The faith of a child spoke to me in a mighty way.

To get you started, here is what goes into each kit.

## Primaria (USA grades 1 - 6)

- 1-24 count box of Crayons
- 1- 20 count pkg. #2 Pencils
- 1- pair blunt tip scissors
- 1- big pink eraser
- 1- pencil sharpener
- 1-12" Ruler with Metric measurements
- 1- 4 oz bottle school glue (Tape lid closed!)
- 1- yellow highlighter
- 4- pocket folders
- 1- spiral notebook 70 ct. wide rule paper
- 1- 150 count pkg. loose leaf paper wide rule

## Secundaria (USA grades 7 - 9)

- 1-24 count Colored Pencils
- 1- 20 count pkg. #2 Pencils

- 1- pair student scissors (pointed tip is OK)
