Walking on Water in the Desert

When you respond to the call of God in your life, you step out of the boat and just go - with only a vague idea of where it all might lead. It's the Lord who shapes what it will look like. Just like Peter, you step out on water- you don't know what you're doing or where you're going. You only know there's *something* that compels you to get out of the boat.

When such a call came in March 2001, I just knew I had to write out the vision. Which developed into our mission statement. Which turned into our brochure. Which has become the blueprint for our lives. Across in Mexico and in our area we built relationships with pastors, volunteers, and mission groups. Together we began to minister to widows, orphans, and anyone else who was in need of help. The pastors in Mexico have many more needy people than we can provide for, so we do what we can. Each pastor gets at least 10 "family packs" of beans and rice and he must make decisions every week on who really needs each pack. Pastor Perea told me he meets with his church leadership and they pray over the food he picks up from Crossing Borders. Then they make the tough call on who receives and who does without that week. They really count on our help - your help - to meet needs and bring the blessings of food and clothing to people. Some have said our ministry is not "evangelistic" enough, that we need to see "salvations" - people coming to and following Christ. We've been called to help meet needs so that the Lord CAN bring salvation to the soul AFTER they've been saved from starvation! Because language is still a barrier, it's our actions and not words that have communicated God's love to the Mexican people. They are getting their stomachs AND their spirits fed, praise the Lord!

The flip side is, not only are there needy people in Mexico but in Fabens, Tornillo, Ft. Hancock, and other little *colonias* on the US side. Some of these are different needs, different kinds of hunger, but God has caused us to minister to all of these that we can. He has brought us into the paths of kids. Some are "special needs" kids, while others have "needs" not so easily seen. They are outcasts, cast-offs, unlovely to everyone but Jesus. Right now, we're trying to make an eternal difference in the lives of 30 girls who don't have fathers! The men in their lives are either dead, in jail, or otherwise "unavailable" for them. And for some of them even "mom" is the grandmother. Who could know when we began in 2001 we'd be ministering in our own backyard! The week of Easter Break, a youth group from Corinth, Texas came to work with the youth in Fabens. Every afternoon and evening they set up a huge inflatable "obstacle course" in the county park just below where we live and invited kids to hang out and learn about Jesus. It was an awesome week!

Working with these kids in Fabens is a whole new chapter in "walking on water". They come to youth group with no encouragement from their families. They come dressed wrong, act wrong, and speak wrong - but they come because even though they don't realize it, God is calling them to come discover HIS plan for their lives. It's comfortable inside the "four walls" of life, but when you're exposed to their world - stepping into their lives with all of hell breaking loose around you, it's a vulnerable, scary place. One teen girl was beaten up by an angry exboyfriend. Three of the boys are already involved in gang activity. They're 11, 12, and 13 years old. A brother and sister were suddenly whisked off to California last week. They'd both just accepted Jesus as their Savior and were thrilled to receive some especially nice gift Bibles. One of our 10 year old girls was able to pray with them before they left. Still another of our 12 year old girls has been taken to Mexico with only a moment's notice. We have people trying to find where she and her mom have gone to. Like I said, a vulnerable, scary place.

James 1:27 reads: "Pure and genuine religion in the sight of God the Father means caring for orphans and widows in their distress and refusing to let the world corrupt you." Caring for hurting people in their distress can be a messy business. It's much easier to "go with the flow". At least, that's what the world has influenced us is easier. Disposable bottles, disposable packaging, disposable everything. Much easier to just not deal with things. But here's what I hope: in spite of it all, you'll open your spiritual ears and hear your own call from God. Come on, don't you want to walk on the water with HIM?



Prayers & Praises

- Barbie's mom, Helen Campos, had an aggressive form of cancer caught early and removed last month. She's now cancer free, but still undergoing radiation treatments just to make sure. She & her family need our prayers & encouragement.
- Maria Felix Rodriguez, wife of Pastor Jose Cruz from Dios Es Amor Church in Sauzal, is scheduled for surgery on her right eye May 30, followed by surgery on the other eye in July. They have been saving money for the two surgeries but are \$700 short. She asks for prayer that either the Lord heals her eyes or makes provision for the finances.
- The cost of beans and rice is going up even faster than gas prices! Meanwhile, donations are dwindling. Pray that we'll be able to keep feeding the 300 needy families who depend on this ministry every week. Pray for those who keep 2400# of beans coming through FBC Cloudcroft each month.

- Many thanks also to Pastor Tom Goss & the men from The Christian Home, who've recently "come on board" to provide the needed "muscle" to unload our monthly shipment from Grace of Giving. That's 3000# rice plus extra groceries for the Mexico pastors each month!
- And pray for Greg Beard (Grace of Giving), as he goes to work overseas in order to keep ministries like ours supplied.
- And there's just not enough room to thank each of you by name who keep this ministry funded & functioning! But the LORD knows! We pray for your health & families & that you might be BLESSEDeven as you are such a blessing!

Even with rising gas and food prices, we as Americans still have plenty of "disposable" income. We think we're "giving up" something if we have to switch from a "name brand" to a "store brand"! So here's a real object lesson: on the right are 35 locations totaling 380 families, but we only have enough beans and rice each week for 300. Which 80 families have to "give up" their week's supply?

That's the real-life decisions we and these pastors are faced with each and every week. Please pray for all of us! It's heart-breaking to look an elderly person or a mom with 5 kids in the face and tell them, "I'm sorry. I don't have anything for you today." If the present money crunch is tough on us, just imagine how much tougher it is on them. Only GOD has the answer for how to multiply the little we have so that it's "enough". Please don't take this as a "guilt trip". Your support of this ministry is awesome! Just putting it out there for you to dig deep in prayer.
