We have been collecting school supplies for the children for many years. In Mexico, when children don't have school supplies, they are not allowed to attend school. In fact these children are only required to attend school through the 6th grade! When a child is able to attend secondary (our middle school) and preparatory (high school) it is quite an accomplishment.

The violence in Mexico has resulted in thousands of children being orphaned. Many of these children are being raised by aunts, uncles, grandparents, and are even in orphanages. This fact came to me once again as we were looking through the pictures of the kids receiving their supplies last year. I noticed one picture of a grandmother and a young boy and couldn't get that picture out of my mind. I have found myself praying for this grandmother and all the others who have taken children in because of the horrible circumstances of this violence that still plagues Mexico.

I would ask you to join us in prayer as well. Just think how much encouragement a packet of school supplies brings. It brings hope in place of despair, and joy unspeakable!

For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me.

I was in prison, and you visited me
And the King will say, "I tell you the truth,

when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!" (Matthew 25:35, 36, 40 NLT)
