We might not know about your particular ordeal, but we've been praying for everyone touched by these disasters. Perhaps, the thing that's turned your world upside down wasn't any of the floods, fires, or earthquakes but the storms that come from emotional upheaval or spiritual crisis. We're praying for you, too.

Living in the desert has an "up" side, if you can call it that. We're always hot in the summer, and it never rains except as a 30 minute deluge that washes out yards and streets, and then it's hot and dry again. For us that's "normal". The spiritual darkness is so great here, it's a wonder anyone survives. We were surprised at just how many kids are still in the communities across the Rio Grande in Mexico. We expected the pastors to ask for fewer kits than last year, but they asked for the same amount, and more in some cases! Each downtown may look like a ghost town - with stores boarded up and no supplies to be had. But the people themselves have nowhere else to go, so in their cultural way they figure, "we might as well send the kids to school." The 1700 school kits went to 40 locations - some all the way to Torreón and also

It's a privilege to minister alongside these pastors, doing whatever we can to strengthen and encourage them "in the faith."

Over the summer, I've watched my "Wednesday girls" make baby steps of growing in the Lord. Now that school's started, the group added 4 new girls - band students - that they invited to come with them to church. Of course it's, "Elfi can you come pick us all up at the band building?" Of course I say, "Yes!" My girls are growing bolder in witnessing about their faith to students and teachers alike, and even telling others how they can ask Jesus to come into their hearts and save them! They still deal with a lot of dark issues in their homes and within themselves, but it's such a "shot in the arm" to hear one girl lead another girl to Christ right in front of me during class! Thank you for all your prayers over these girls - your prayers haven't been in vain! Thank you, too, for the many ways you help us "keep the faith!"

Just the other day, I received a phone call from the lost and found service that handles Fed-Ex claims. The woman was calling because they had 18 large zip type bags with assorted school supplies in them. It was our "missing" box from Pennsylvania! "Tara" and her co-workers had looked up our website, and she wanted to tell us they think all we're doing is so great. She shared that she remembered her mom always had a heart for kids in Mexico, and used to gather up clothes to send for them. When I described how the pastors give us lists and that there's a name attached to every kit that goes out, she said it made her want to cry! The day she called was a stress-filled one for us, so I'm not sure who was blessed more by the call her or me!

The killings continue in Mexico and it's nearly impossible to imagine what it's like to live in such conditions. People have been severely beaten or killed just because they had the misfortune to see what happened to their neighbor.
