Working in the Whirlwind

We hope this newsletter finds you well in these difficult times. The pastors and their churches in Mexico join us in praying for your health and safety every day! They've come to think of you as family who are part of the Crossing Borders network of support. Truly, your continued support has literally been a lifeline for them and their families. The storms of life may be overwhelming right now, yet we know GOD IS ALWAYS WORKING! And in that knowledge we all stand, continuing the work He has called us to.

Not much has changed along the border since our last newsletter. The ports of entry are closed to all except "essential" travel. Miraculously, Omar Lara has still been able to cross into Mexico every two weeks, carrying a truck loaded to capacity with groceries and other provisions for many pastoral families. He has just been called back to work in the oil fields, so he's putting even more miles on his truck as he commutes back and forth on weekends. He's fully committed to GOD's call in his life to serve as pastor of our home church (FBC Fabens) and keep hauling groceries across to the pastors in Mexico.

As Omar's wife and partner in ministry, Luly's is "holding down the fort" here both in their home and in the weekly operation of CBM. She and family members meet scheduled deliveries, prepare the grocery sacks for the pastors, and take beans & rice to the church members who are quarantined in their homes. She and her mother-in-law Esperanza will often go over to the church by themselves to clean and spend hours in prayer. She calls it "therapy." We call them our secret prayer warriors! During the week we spent getting school kits ready for Mexico, these two along with sister-in-law Gabby made home cooked Mexican food as their thank you to our small crew. You haven't had Mexican food any better than what these three can cook!

Speaking of school supplies, this has been an unusual year for every part of ministry and the supply kit drive was no exception. Groups planning to come had to cancel due to COVID numbers here and quarantine requirements afterward. Deliveries had to be worked out in advance so everything could be here the last week of July. The pastors had to get their name lists for how many kits they each needed to Omar in time so he could have them to us that same week. But nothing is impossible with GOD! Even though obstacles arose, from July 27-31 we had the help of a GOD-ordained team who pulled together and processed over 2000 school supply kits—sorted, boxed, and labeled for each pastor. Meanwhile, Luly's spoke to one Mexican customs officer after another, seeking permission to cross the kits. Whenever she got a "no" she prayed some more and asked someone else. On Sunday August 2, she and Omar asked one more time, and got a "yes!" By late afternoon they had crossed a trailer load of some 1000 kits to meet up with the pastors at a central location. By week's end, they had everything across so the pastors could prepare to safely distribute the kits.

We still need to travel once a month back to Fabens for the things that can't be done electronically. But we're taking the necessary precautions to stay well!

We ask you to continue to pray for all of us as we pray for all of you! May the LORD pour out blessings over you and carry you through the midst of these troubled days.
