The hurdles of continuing to minister in the midst of a pandemic have been challenging to say the least. In years gone by we've had large teams of volunteers to help us process over 3000 Christmas shoeboxes that are delivered to needy children along our border region of Mexico. This year we had to limit the number of people who could work at one time, and also had a hard time working around folks who would have to quarantine after coming from other places. In case you hadn't heard, El Paso county is a COVID hotspot that doesn't seem to be "flattening the curve" any time soon. Even in Fabens, there are hundreds of cases at any one time, with many thousands in surrounding communities.

With so many churches being closed around the country and restrictions as to how many could attend when they were allowed to open, donations of shoeboxes were much lower. Some churches chose not to participate. For the first time in 20 years, we had to decline some requests for gifts and cut back on a few others. But GOD is always working! There were others who stepped up to the challenges of navigating store limits and other obstacles so that we were able to still send out almost 2400 gifts to 44 different locations. People who had never worked with us brought gifts as well as some of our intrepid friends, and we even gained a new co-laborer who was truly a blessing from GOD! She showed up ready to work for two weeks straight and took to the task like she'd been doing it for years. *Gracias, Cristina*!

We also want to express our gratitude to the Pittmans and Keiths who stayed and worked a week each, our ranchers from New Mexico who sacrificed a loooong day of driving to spend a few hours with us, and our own little band of volunteers from church who not only helped with the gifts but fed us awesome (and HOT) Mexican food. Of course, there is the unseen army out there who did all that shopping and packing and dropping off to central locations. Many hands went into making this year's gift drive possible and God knows you each by name! May the Lord Jesus bless and keep you in these challenging days for helping Him bring joy into the lives of so many children on the day we celebrate His birthday! Praying you have a Merry Christmas and a blessed New Year!
