This year so far has been a flurry of activity. Getting the Christmas DVD published and out to participants. Contribution statements for last year. Scheduling in mission teams for this year. Trying to get a leaky roof replaced on the church sanctuary and annex buildings. Oh, and writing this newsletter of course!

Here it is the end of February but (as you'll see on the back page) we're already starting to fill up our calendar. We hope you'll make special note of the due dates we've set for our **School Supply Kit Drive** and **Christmas Shoebox Drive**. These two projects are huge events for us every year, helping very needy children along our part of the border region in Mexico. We've been doing this 16 years now together, and we can't stress enough the eternal impact you have helped make in the lives of literally thousands of children! Some of them have gone on to graduate university because of those kits! Last year we were able to send <u>2200</u> children to school in a nation where education means all the difference between poverty and opportunity. Also, when we finally shipped out the last shoebox gifts, we had brightened the lives of <u>2700</u> children with a Christmas present from Jesus! It was the ONLY gift received for most of them!

Just to help newcomers to our CBM "family" know how things work, we operate on a weekly schedule. Those bringing deliveries & donations call to set up a time to come during the week. Then, every Tuesday we set up a distribution point in the annex of our host church, First Baptist-Fabens. We open from 9:00 AM until Noon. Pastors from Mexico cross the local international bridge to pick up beans, rice, grocery items, clothing, medicines, and any other needed goods we've received for them. Through this network of pastors we're able to feed as many as 400 families every week. We've also been able to supply Bibles, teaching/VBS materials, and even folding tables and chairs for their churches & ministries. We never cease to be amazed at how God uses the simplest things to bring joy and blessing to the lives and ministries that we serve.

Joy in Serving

There's a joy in serving that's hard to grasp. For the most part ministry IS hard. It can be discouraging, heart-breaking, and even unfulfilling at times. That's when we have to pull back and remember it's not about us, not for our glory, but for the glory of God. It's HIS passion and HIS purposes we are called to, not our own. We use the symbol of the hand sowing seeds to show how the Lord continues to sow His seeds through us and CBM. Without Him, we wouldn't be blessed with all the food and the many things that have passed through this ministry for all these years. As we minister to the needs of the poor, we also sow into the lives of the pastors and their wives and children. We sow into those in our surrounding community, in our own church, and in our faithful support and prayer partners. Sometimes we feel stretched to the breaking point. Our brains get "fried" as we flip from sharing and speaking with our American friends to struggling to communicate with a sea of people who only speak Spanish. Yet when the Lord called us He said we would be on a path only we could follow. So every time we seem to accomplish the "impossible," we are reminded He has built a unique skill set into us that makes it possible. And in that there's great joy!
