We were excited to present CBM during Missions Day at Big Country Baptist Assembly in May. It gave us an opportunity to speak to 3 different Baptist Associations at once. Collectively, they represented churches that donate over half the school supply kits each year as well as support many other ministries we oversee. Once in the Cloudcroft, NM area, there were a multitude of opportunities to minister through music, speaking, and sharing about the latest happenings along our border region. It was a blessing to see so many friends in the little mountain villages and campgrounds. The plan was to be there 8 weeks, but a 9th one was added due to catching a bad summer cold that made us too sick to drive home! We missed out on seeing our Lamesa mission team friends who put on 2 VBS programs in the area and delivered hundreds of like-new chairs for the churches in Mexico. Thankfully, we were nursed to health by a friend's homemade Jewish matzo ball soup!

We were able to get back home just ahead of the school supply kit rush. While the team from Oklahoma was leading VBS in Mexico and at FBC Fabens, we were hustling to do weeks of preparation in a few days' time. We were so grateful for the team from Tri County Association who joined us and our local volunteers to sort loose donations, organize all the kits that came in, shop with financial gifts to make enough kits to meet the needs, and run inventory over and over again.

It takes many hands to see the School Supply Drive through all its stages, but thousands of kids were blessed with an education and hope for a better future. This year it meant everything for a group of kids living in a squatter settlement called Rancho Anapra. They'd learned in Sunday School about praying "morning, noon, and night." With the simple faith of children, they walked to their church 3 times every day, praying that God would help them get supplies to attend school, because their parents didn't have jobs to buy them. Meanwhile, Pastor Omar and wife Luly's (always searching for places of great need) were told by his sister-in-law, Gaby, about "Leon de Juda" Church. Unaware the kids had been praying "morning, noon, and night," they traveled out there to take school kits and meet the pastor. Not sure who was more blessed that day—the kids or Omar and Luly's! The Lord truly works in mysterious ways!

## Important Update on Pastor Enrique

The struggle continues for our Pastor, Enrique Ornelas. Thank you for your prayers so far, and we urge you to keep up the spiritual warfare. Every step of his journey has been plagued by delays and misinformation. The Board of Immigration Appeal sent back his petition without reviewing anything, stating it wasn't filed "within 30 days of the ruling." Enrique's attorney is filing a motion to protest their claim.

In December, they were told by the immigration judge he would let them know of his ruling in "a few weeks." Then there was the government shutdown in January. They kept calling their attorney, but no one had heard anything, so they kept going to their monthly appointments with the immigration office. In April, an officer new to their case informed them the computer said there'd been a deportation order on them since December! He advised them to contact their attorney immediately. The attorney demanded an answer from the court, and was finally supplied with a copy of the ruling - in April. The appeal was promptly filed after that. So the problem is the judge ruled against asylum on Dec. 8, but they weren't able to file the appeal until April, when they had the ruling in hand and knew what grounds they had for appeal.

All of this has been frightening for the Ornelas family and heartbreaking for us! We returned from our latest trip this month to find they had put an ankle monitor on Pastor Enrique! What an outrageous insult toward this man who has followed EVERY instruction given him by immigration authorities!

### Yet the Lord is always working

Though they are worried, Enrique and wife Nena are choosing to trust God has a plan in place—even if none of us can see it right now. When the agent went to put a monitor on Nena first, she was so distraught and crying that he couldn't bring himself to do it. He admitted to Enrique that this wasn't right, especially him being pastor of a church. But it was his job and he was required to do it. He was choosing the "wisdom of Solomon" and "cutting the baby in half," only putting the monitor

on Enrique. (Solomon didn't actually cut a baby in half, but his command to do so was to reveal the heart of the real mother) A female agent whispered to them that she, too, was trusting God would honor their faith in Him.

When we went to the post office, several checks had come in specifically for Enrique's legal fees. So we know all hope is not lost! The Lord wouldn't put it on peoples' hearts to send donations for him unless there was a case to be made. So keep on praying, prayer warriors! It's not over till it's over!
